The Albert Williams Fund Proposal
for Anthropology Undergraduate Majors

The Williams Fund makes it possible for the department to support research and study in limited amounts for undergraduate majors' senior essays. Such aid is intended to improve the quality and efficiency of majors' research. Williams Funds grants for undergraduate majors are approximately \$250.00 in their senior year.

The application should have attached a funding proposal, no more than three pages double spaced, outlining the project and should indicate that related necessary preparations (e.g., contacts with local scholars or authorities, research permission/visas, admission or registration in a program) have been made. A fully itemized budget documenting estimated costs must be completed within the application. The signature of the applicant's senior essay advisor is required. The application (with attachment) should be submitted to the Department Registrar's office, 10 Sachem Street, Room 102.

Williams Fund applications are considered once each semester. The fall deadline is November 1; the spring deadline is April 2, with decisions forthcoming shortly thereafter. Normally funds will be allocated for travel and living expenses associated with visits to field research sites, archives, library or museum collections. Requests for purchase of equipment (such as cameras and tape recorders) will not be considered.
