

Josef ALBERS Traveling Fellowships

The Josef Albers Foundation has established a fellowship at Yale University to be used for awards to Yale students (currently enrolled in a graduate or undergraduate program), post-doctoral appointees, and faculty for travel expenses in connection with scholarly research involving pre-Columbian or Colonial art and artifacts of Mesoamerica, Central America and South America. Applicants are expected to have knowledge of the study area based on specific coursework or training and should provide a summary of this background in their fellowship proposal.

Fellowship funds are intended primarily to cover travel expenses, including lodging and per diem. No awards will be made for the purchase of photographic or other expensive equipment. Grants are ordinarily in the range of \$1,000 - \$5,000. Students or faculty affiliated with other colleges or universities are not eligible. Please note that award funds are considered to be taxable income.

1. Applicants must complete the Albers-Coe-Hazard Application which summarizes their proposal. The ACH application is located on Anthropology's main website. Please complete all information requested on the application and obtain the signature of one of the following which is required: the applicant's mentor, committee chairperson, dissertation/thesis/essay advisor or Director of Undergraduate Studies.

2. Attach a brief statement (no more than three double spaced pages) describing the intended use of the fund with a fully itemized budget. Please include: destination, dates of travel, and purpose. Any change in the scope or budget of the project after submission should be reported to the department/council office. If funding is awarded to you, a paragraph of your research must be reported to the department/council office within 90 days after the completion of your fieldwork.

If an awardee also qualifies for an award from the Williams, the Berkeley, Biddle and Woolsey Scholarship, the Hazard, the Coe or the Dorot Funds, or other awards for the same project, the recipient must clearly indicate whether such application has been made. Indicate to whom (please furnish contact information), for what items and amounts other requests have been made, and include deadline and decision announcement dates for those other requests.

Responsibility for the selection of Fellowship recipients resides with the Chairman of the Council on Archaeological Studies who has appointed an advisory committee to assist with the decision process.

COE Summer Fieldwork Fund

The Michael COE funds are intended primarily for undergraduate Archaeological Studies majors seeking to fulfill their summer fieldwork requirement. Others may be considered mainly if they are accompanying CAS faculty on their summer projects. CAS registered M.A and Anthropology Ph.D. students in the archaeology subfield may also apply for funding for projects related to their theses/dissertations.

You must provide the following information as part of your application:

1. Applicants must complete the Albers-Coe-Hazard Application, located on Anthropology's main website, which summarizes their proposal. Please complete all information requested on the application and obtain the signature of one of the following which is required: the applicant's mentor, committee chairperson, dissertation/thesis/essay advisor or Director of Undergraduate Studies.
2. Attach proposal containing: A brief, narrative description of the project or field school, listing its dates and describing the fieldwork and other experiences you will undertake. An indication of how this project or field school will further your archaeological skills and (if applicable) preparation for the senior essay or thesis/dissertation. And a detailed, itemized budget including all travel and other fieldwork costs for which you are requesting assistance.

*Please note that award funds are considered to be taxable income.

Be sure to indicate if you are a declared Archaeological Studies major and your year of graduation. Any change in the scope or budget of the project after submission should be reported to the council/department office immediately. If funding is awarded to you, a paragraph of your research must be reported to the department/council office within 90 days after the completion of your fieldwork. Typically, the COE Fund pays for travel expenses, and only additional costs if there is enough funding available. You may ask for support beyond travel, but be aware that this may or may not be awarded.

All majors should speak to the DUS of CAS or Department of Anthropology about their choices before applying to formulate the most appropriate field experience.

Augusta HAZARD Fund

The Augusta Hazard Fund is a research fellowship available to Ph.D. graduate students who plan foreign travel for archaeological research during the summer. Grants, which are intended to help defray travel expenses, ordinarily range from \$1,000 - \$1,500. Normally, money from the Hazard Fund will be allocated only for travel expenses, including lodging and per diem. Requests for the purchase of equipment will not be considered. Please note that award funds are considered to be taxable income.

1. Applicants must complete the Albers-Coe-Hazard Application, which summarizes their proposal. The ACH application is located on Anthropology's main website. Please complete all information requested on the application and obtain the signature of one of the following which is required: the applicant's mentor, committee chairperson, dissertation/thesis/essay advisor or Director of Undergraduate Studies.
2. Attach a brief statement (no more than two double spaced pages) describing the intended use of the fund with a fully itemized budget. Please include: destination, dates of travel, and purpose. Any change in the scope or budget of the project after submission should be reported to the department/council office. If funding is awarded to you, a paragraph of your research must be reported to the department/council office within 90 days after the completion of your fieldwork.

If a student might also qualify for an award from the Williams Fund, the Albers Fellowship or other award for the same project, the student must clearly indicate whether such application has been made. Indicate to whom other requests have been made (please furnish contact information), for what items and amounts, and include deadline and decision announcement dates for those other requests.

Any change in the scope or budget of the project after submission should be reported to the council/ department office. If funding is awarded to you, a paragraph of your research must be reported to the department/council office within 90 days after the completion of your fieldwork.
